This Week's Hot Topics

- RAUNER VETOES BULK OF STATE BUDGET— Republican
 Gov. Bruce Rauner sought Thursday to ratchet up pressure
 on Democratic lawmakers to approve his pro-business,
 anti-union agenda, vetoing the bulk of the state budget
 while dangling an offer of pension relief for Chicago and
 Cook County.
- HIGH COURT SAVES HEALTH LAW— The Supreme Court on Thursday upheld a pillar of the Affordable Care Act, rescuing for the second time the most ambitious social program in nearly 50 years and ensuring that the law's ultimate fate will be in the hands of the political process. The 6-3 ruling, written by Chief Justice John Roberts, upheld a signature achievement of President Barack Obama's tenure.
- NEW STUDY FINDS MORE KIDS SENT TO ER OVER FOOD ALLERGY REACTIONS— The rate of emergency room visits and hospitalizations of children with severe food allergy reactions nearly tripled in Illinois over five years, reports a new study released Friday by Northwestern Medicine. "This study is really important because it shows the impact food allergies are having — especially in Illinois," said lead study author, Dr. Ruchi Gupta, a professor of pediatrics at Northwestern University Feinberg School of Medicine. "The big question is why ... and that's what we are working to find out", Gupta said.

- WORLD'S AQUIFERS LOSING REPLENISHMENT RACE— From the Arabian Peninsula to northern India to California's Central Valley, nearly a third of the world's 37 largest aquifers are being drained faster than they are being replenished, according to a recent study led by scientists at the University of California, Irvine.
- SEN. STABENOW CALLS FOR VOLUNTARY COUNTRY-OF-ORIGIN LABELS ON MEAT— With Canada and Mexico threatening retaliatory action against the U.S. for requiring country-of-origin labels on meat sold in the U.S., a key Senate Democrat is pushing for a voluntary label that still allows domestic beef and pork to be identified as a "Product of the U.S." Sen. Debbie Stabenow (D., Mich.), ranking member of the Senate Agriculture Committee, promoted the plan Thursday during a hearing, calling it a "the basis for a bipartisan solution."
